WORDING FOR AGENDA ITEM: Discussion on 2015 United Way Employee Contribution Campaign and Corporate Pledge

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The United Way of Siouxland is holding its Annual Campaign to raise funds for their Community Impact Fund, which provides support services on Education, Income, and Health for families in Siouxland. The Campaign Chair for Woodbury County seeks direction from the Board of Supervisors on resources to assist in the implementation of a County employee contribution program and consideration of a corporate pledge.

BACKGROUND: In previous years the Board of Supervisors have provided \$500-\$700 for an employee contribution campaign budget. Last year the Board approved \$500 and 2 days of paid time off for the employee contribution campaign. Last year Woodbury County employees donated \$20,686 in contributions. This was an increase from the previous year in which \$18,332 was raised. The Board of Supervisors have never provided a corporate pledge.

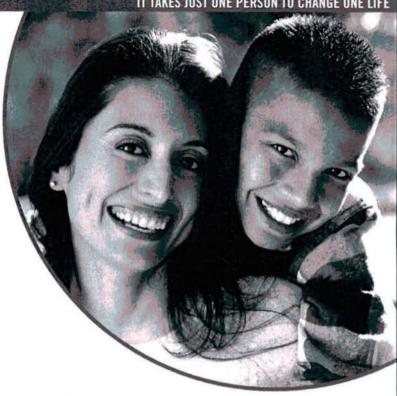
