Human Resources in clear delineation of job performances and duties shall require the following policy: On all buildings owned by the county, the Building Services Department under the Direction of the Building Superintendent shall be the representative to the Board in all negotiations, contracts, specifications, and designs. Furthermore, it shall be the policy that the Building Superintendent will be involved in understanding the scope of work, designing, directing, and interfacing with all outside contractors as the Board's representative. The Building Superintendent shall submit approval and signature of certificate of substantial completion when satisfied that his or her personnel is properly trained on all equipment, manufacturers' warranties, service numbers, and service-related items.
